• The eCC Solution

eCC leverages clinical staff to submit eConsults for specified disease states, populations, or referral types, so the PCP can focus on delivering care.

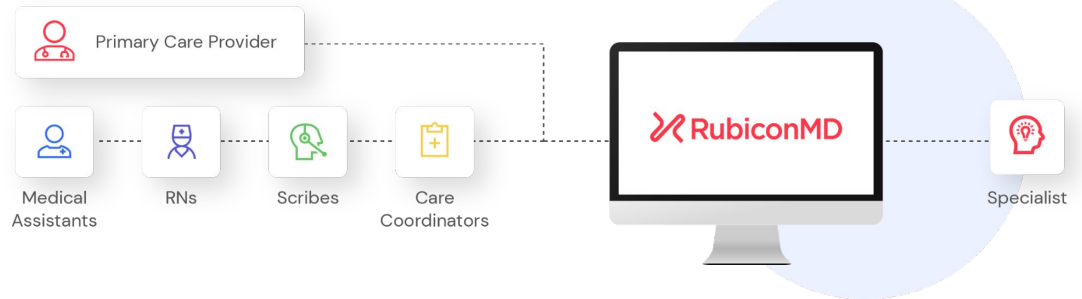
eCC allows support staff to practice at the top of their licenses, improving clinical efficiency and enabling rapid access to care for patients.

eConsult Collaboration

eCC enables members of the care team beyond the PCP to collaborate or submit eConsults on behalf of a PCP using the standard submission criteria.

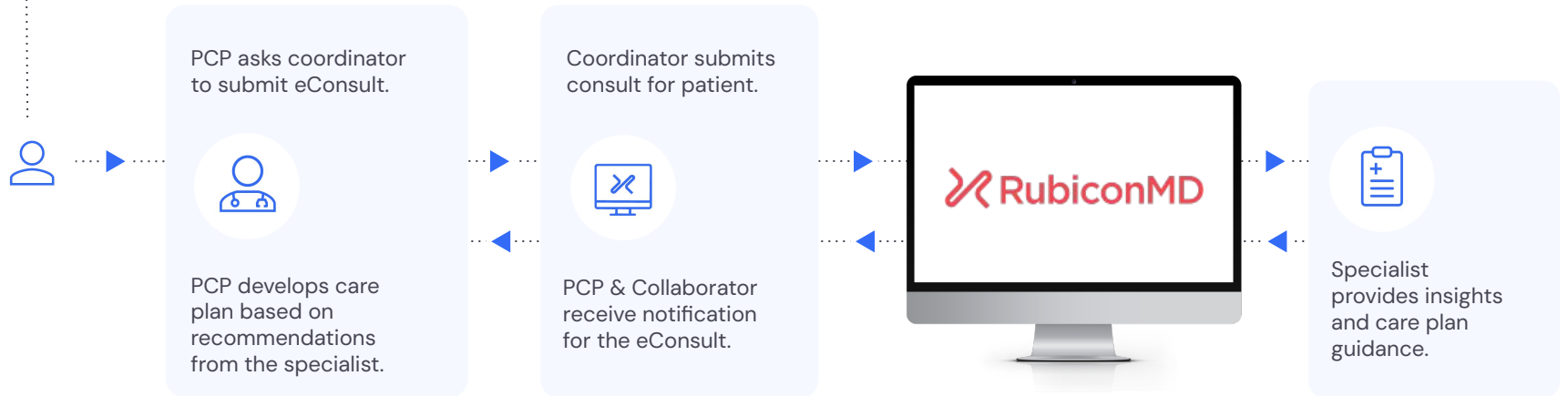

Dermatology

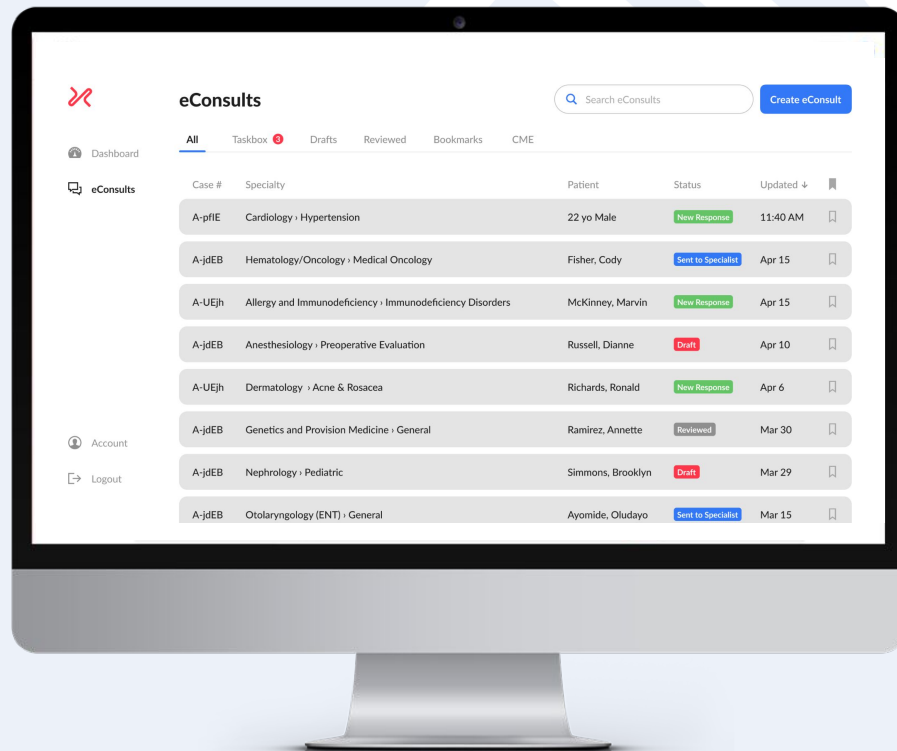

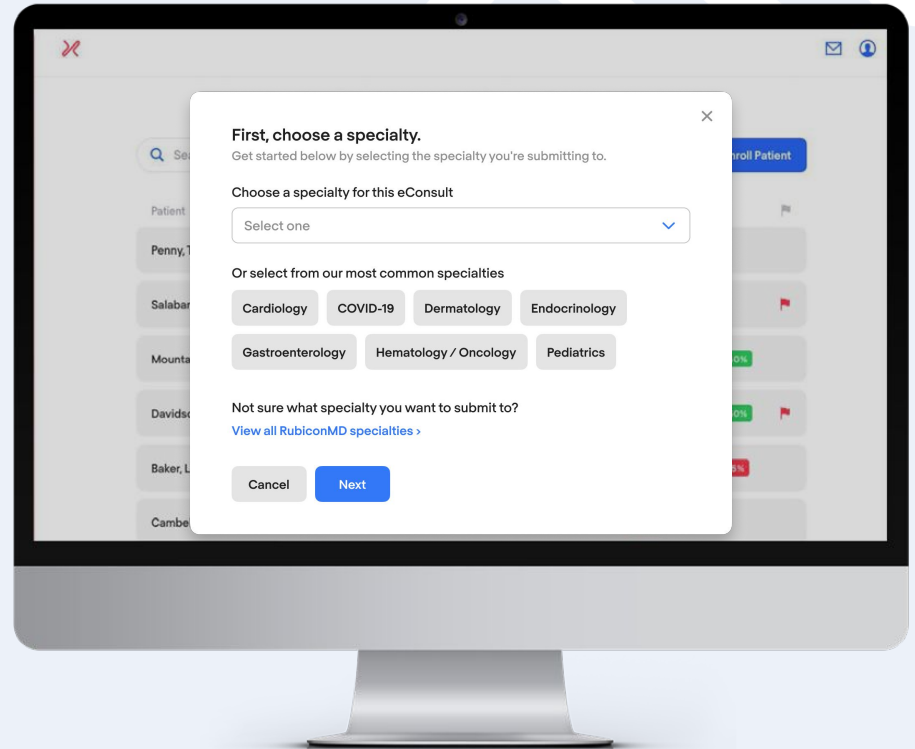
